BINDER TIP SHEET

Reminder: The competition is open to any ABC-NJ general contractor or subcontractor in good standing (dues for 2023 have been paid). To be eligible for the 2023 Excellence in Construction Awards Competition, commercial, industrial, or institutional projects must be completed between October 1, 2022 – September 1, 2023. Note for subcontractors: Only your portion of the work must be complete; not the entire project.

Binder Materials

Please read carefully. All completed materials and payment are due by September 22, 2023. NO entry materials will be accepted after this date, no exceptions. Incomplete binders or incorrect binders will be disqualified.

- Please use plain white paper only and make all forms legible. Do not change forms to fit company letterhead.
- Each entry must be submitted in a 1-inch three ring binder.
- Use tabbed dividers to separate each section outlined below.
- Judges will be judging the binders that are submitted and pictures that are provided with the binders.

- Very important and often missed please email your subcontractor list in Excel format as well as printed in the binder as detailed below.

II. Description of Project (maximum one page)

- a. Building/Project Name
- b. Building/Project Type (commercial/industrial/residential)
- c. Type of contract (i.e. Lump sum, time & materials, construction management at risk, cost plus, etc.)
- d. Project duration
- e. Project size (\$)
- f. Percentage self-performed
- g. Total square feet
- h. Contractor/Supplier list on the job **emailed** to Diane Blair at **dblair@abcnjc.org** and printed and included in the binder. **The required format is Microsoft Excel**. Separate columns are required for each heading (in other words, do not include city & state in same column)

The list should include each company name, address, phone number, fax number, website, email and contact person with a brief description of type of work performed (i.e. drywall, concrete, masonry, lumber supplier, etc.) This list should include ABC Members and non-ABC members; please specify other ABC members so they can be recognized. Note for subcontractors: your list does not need to include the entire project but must include all sub-subcontractors/suppliers in your scope of work.

III. Photographs (minimum of 5 and maximum of 10)

- a. Color photographs of the project with project names, company name, entry category and a descriptive caption telling what the photo represents. The file(s) must be a jpeg or tiff, at least 720x480 pixels and 300 dpi.
- b. Include in-progress and post-completion photos.
- c. Renovations/restorations must have before and after photos.
- d. Digital pictures are required on CD or USB drive in addition to the photos in the notebook.
- e. 10 photos highly recommended.
- f. If photos are by 3rd party, include photographer's use of authorization.
- g. PLEASE DESIGNATE ONE PHOTO THAT WILL BE PRINTED ON POSTER

IV. Project Narrative (maximum four pages)

a. Tell us what makes your project special. Be as specific as possible and concentrate on construction aspects, not design features. Highlight any unique features or challenges your company faced when completing the project. Tell us about innovative programs relating to personnel management, teamwork, quality control, scheduling, value engineering, etc., to make the project award winning. Explain how your expertise led to completion in a timely and cost-effective manner? This can be five pages if it is classified as community or public service.

V. Safety

- a. Please place other required material from the Safety form behind the form provided in this packet. These materials should be submitted in the following order:
 - 1. Project Safety Form
 - 2. OSHA 300 and OSHA 300A forms (with personal information redacted)
 - 3. STEP Certificate (You must be a Step Participant)
